Rector's Journal

This is the message we have heard from him and proclaim to you, that God is light and in him there is no darkness at all. If we say that we have fellowship with him while we are walking in darkness, we lie and do not do what is true; but if we walk in the light as he himself is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin. – I John 1:5-7

One of the aspects of the Easter season that often gets overlooked among all the theological ideas competing for our attention is community. Yet, it is really at the heart of Easter and all its theological spiritual importance. Ideas like resurrection, forgiveness of sins, salvation, among others, become less significant, watered down, without the concept of community at their very core.

As Joan Chittister writes, "In community we work out our connectedness to God, to one another, and to ourselves. It is in community where we find out who we really are... In human relationships I learn how to soften my hard spots and how to reconcile and how to care for someone else besides myself. In human relationships I learn that theory is no substitute for love. It is easy to talk about the love of God, it is another thing to practice it." (J. Chittister, OSB, "Wisdom Distilled From the Daily")

So let us keep this in mind always as we think about our community of faith we call St. John's Church. It is the place for us to experiment with and test the limits of our relationships, trusting that with Christ as our source, we're more apt to find our community growing than being limited. Not always the easiest work, community, but by far among the greatest rewards of entering into life together as the body of Christ.

Communities also change. People live and die. People come and go. I've learned recently that our community will soon look a bit different, with the departure of Deacon Barbara Gibson from our church staff. Having been on a personal leave of absence since December, Barbara now feels called to devote her time to her work with Episcopal Social Services and Kansas to Kenya, along with devoting time to her family as a mother and grandmother.

In her time among us, she has blessed St. John's ministry with her skills and her passion. Our Outreach ministries, in particular, have been strengthened because of Barbara's gifts and abilities. We will miss her, but will remain connected with her through convocation and diocesan ministries.

The parish will have a chance to say good bye as Deacon Barbara will be with us in worship on April 12th at 8:00 service, April 19th at 10:30 service, and April 26th at both services and the last Sunday of the month breakfast. I invite you all to thank her for all she's done in the midst of our community.



A Look Back at St. John's History



John Price Hilton

145 years ago

John Price Hilton's report to the Diocesan Convention, May 1871:

"I commenced to hold the services twice each Sunday, in April, 1870, and continued till December, when we had to suspend them, as the log church where I was holding services was too cold and damp—only having a sawdust floor, and we had no means to dry or warm it—(the lighting has been done at my own expense). On Easter



Sunday I commenced services in a large room and find a growing interest in the Episcopal services, and a better attendance. . ."

137 years ago

The Kansas Churchman, May 15, 1878: [Easter is observed in 1878] "by appropriate Sunday School services. The room was decorated profusely with flowers, a large floral cross constituting one of the most conspicuous features of the arrangements. Colored Easter eggs were distributed to the children to whom the occasion was one of great gladness."

135 years ago

Wichita Eagle, April I, 1880: The Rev. Colton's church was redolent with floral offerings on Easter Sunday and the services throughout the day were interesting.

128 years ago

The Living Church, April 23, 1887: Wichita—Easter 1887 marks a notable era in the life of St. John's parish. It is gratifying to observe that the marvelous material progress of this city hardly surpasses its growth in religious and educational matters. Taking the lead in church building, St. John's Vestry have purchased a lot of ample dimensions in a most desirable location. The present church building is far too small to accommodate the congregation which has rapidly increased under the judicious management and earnest preaching of the present rector. The Vestry recently ordered a fine two-manual organ, which has just now been completed by the Messrs. Pilcher of Louisville and was used for the first time at the Easter services. Three times in the day was the church filled beyond its seating capacity, the aisles and all vacant spaces being filled with chairs. The number of communicants was unusually large. The sermon of the morning was a most powerful one on "The Risen Christ" from the text "Now is Christ risen and become the first fruits of them that slept."

124 years ago

The Kansas Churchman, May 1891: Easter day brought out a good congregation. Our new choir acquitted itself very creditably in the rendering of the church music. The church was tastefully decorated, by the Altar chapter. In the afternoon was held children's service, Easter carols together with a nice address by the Rector, occupied the time while the Secretary was opening the missionary boxes. The boxes with the afternoon offering gave us \$26 which was devoted to Domestic Missions. Each child present was made happy by the gift of a potted plant.

121 years ago

The Kansas Churchman, May 1894: Easter at St. John's Church, Wichita, was a red-letter day in the history of the church. At both the morning and evening services hundreds were unable to gain admittance. The new stone church celebrated its first Easter in a manner which manifested the joy and gratitude of every member of the now thriving and flourishing parish. The quartette choir consisting of four of the best singers in the city rendered musical selections at the morning service. At the evening service there was an immense audience. Hundreds could not enter the church. The night music was rendered by the vested choir of twenty-four voices which was the first occasion of a surpliced choir in Wichita. The robed choir consisting of ten young women and ten young men surprised the immense congregation by their most remarkable singing.

120 years ago

The Kansas Churchman, May 1895: Easter services this year were most splendid and largely attended. For three years the local commandery of Knights Templar have been attending in a body, Easter services at St. John's, and this year they appeared forty strong and so great was the interest felt, had it been a pleasant day, there would have been a hundred. Several hundred extra chairs had to be rented from the Auditorium, and then many stood up. In the evening the attendance was even greater yet. The music, . . .was superbly rendered.


