### **Rector's Journal... Savior Confidential**

I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ. (Philippians 1:6)

Confidence is a rare commodity these days. According to Gallup Polling, President Obama's approval rating is presently at a lackluster 46%. Not bad, actually, when you consider that Congress' approval rating is at a dismal 11%. (Ouch!) State leaders are not doing much better. Governor Brownback's approval rating is at 18%, while the Kansas legislature came in at 28%.

Fortunately, the church is not run by politicians in Topeka or Washington DC. The church is run by the people of God. That is to say, our confidence, or the lack thereof, in the mission of the church is not found in leaders (Though to be sure, the church needs strong leadership.) Rather, our confidence is in God and in God's promise to be with and to work through his people. Good works, begun and completed, find their fulfillment in the presence of Christ and the activity of the Spirit, present in the Church.

So, how's your confidence these days? To be honest, it is hard at times to be confident in the mission and ministry of the church. Is the message of the church relevant to 21<sup>st</sup> century seekers? Are we going in the right direction? Is everyone at church on board with the ministry of the Church? Will new leadership emerge for the future good works that God has in store for God's people? There are never clear cut answers to such questions. All we can do is all we've ever done, namely, to have faith in **"the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion."** Advent, the first season of the church year, is about faith and hope, in the promises of God. We begin our yearly liturgical journey at the place at which all of life, with all its twists and turns, all its uncertainties, ultimately ends up, trusting in the promises of God. The promise of a Savior to come, both the celebration of his birth and the expectation of his return, allow us to exercise that part of our being that is crucial for being the Church. The promise of a Savior to come allows us to practice confidence as a spiritual discipline. It allows us to demonstrate to the world that there is something, or more precisely, **someone**, worth putting our

confidence in.

May the joy and peace of this holy season be with each of you, and may the promises of the Savior be yours, now and always.

### **Humble Beginnings**

It is probably the first Bible story we as children learned.

She — Mary — was young and pregnant.

Roman Emperor Caesar Augustus had ordered all families to register at their birthplace. So Mary and Joseph left their home – went out of the city of Nazareth into the city of Bethlehem.

It sounds so simple. They just went. Started walking and then they were there. However, the reality is a bit more challenging. There was no easy, as-the-crow-flies route. To take the safest route, one that avoided hostile Samaritans, they most likely traveled east, crossed into modern day Jordan, went south through the Jordan River Valley, then wound back around into Judea. Joseph and Mary most likely walked a distance of 80 to 90

miles to reach Bethlehem. This was far from a simple journey.

Joseph and Mary must have been road weary. They needed rest. Instead they found a crowded city full of others who had come to be counted. As Mary's time to deliver approached, they looked for shelter. They knocked on doors. Sorry. There is no room in the inn. An innkeeper finally offered them space.

#### On that most Holy Night, they sought refuge, and found it in a stable.

Jesus - born to us as a commoner. No doctor, no nurse. A carpenter father. A young Mother. No robes. No crowns. Born without privilege. From the beginning we learned that this was—

#### A child sent not to be served, but to serve.

May the birth and life of this small Child once again inspire us to look beyond our own wants and desires to the needs of those more humbled among us.

## Wednesday "Contemplative Life" Group Begins December 2 at 6:15 pm



## St. John's History by Parish Historian, Katie Pott

### 145 years ago

**The First Ten Years, 1999:** 1870 closes with six inches of snow falling on December 16, followed by a cold wave on December 22 resulting in the Little Arkansas River freezing six inches deep. In spite of the cold, the little stockade-style church is used for Wichita's first Christmas. **Illustrated History of Early Wichita, 1914, "The First Christmas in Wichita 1870" by Fred Sowers, (first published in the Vidette, December** 

**26, 1870):** "It was a most gladsome occasion; the dirt roof church over which Reverend Hilton, who was of the Episcopal persuasion, was the only place of worship so designated, in Wichita; the ladies of the church had decorated it for the occasion, and a Christmas tree gaily decked with small lighted candles, and the interim branches of the tree loaded with candies and trinkets and rattling with tinsel, was a feast for the few frontier boys and girls, and a moist-eyed reminder to the grown-up attendants produced similar scenes." ~ "Reverend Hilton preached a very appropriate sermon, after which the attendants

r

marched to Morgan Cox's store-room, where a bountiful repast was spread, consisting of buffalo meat prepared in various styles, prairie-chicken, quail-on-toast, venison, and chicken-pie, with cakes, pies and custards, as viands; everybody mingled and freely exchanged thoughts, were happy and made the day truly Christmas like." ~ The evening concludes with dancing to the music of Fred Schattner's string band.

### 137 years ago

**The Kansas Churchman, December 1878:** "We of St. John's Parish, Wichita, are rejoicing in the hope of being able soon to worship God in a house set apart to this sacred purpose. An amount has been subscribed by the towns people and parishioners, that added to the \$500 promised by the Bishop warrants our beginning the work, and we are expecting to lay the corner stone very soon. The church is to be a neat frame Gothic edifice, small, but capable of easy enlargement when necessary. At present we worship and hold Sunday school in 'Russell Hall,' a pleasant room which with the addition of a chancel rail, furnishes us with as suitable a place as any, other than a church edifice. . . . We are making preparations for the Sunday school Christmas Festival, and our workers enter into them with the usual spirit of loving, harmonious zeal which is always an encouragement of the Rector of this Parish." **The First Ten Years:** Gifts from Mr. Colton's former diocese arrived. The Southern Ohio Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions sent a portable communion service paid for by Mr. Colton's former parish, St. John's in Lancaster, the remainder by the Church of the Advent, Cincinnati. On Christmas Eve communion linens, a pair of walnut alms plates and white book marks arrived from the "Altar chapter" of the Women's Guild of Christ Church Chapel in Philadelphia.

### 136 years ago The Kansas Churchman (reprinted from the Wichita Beacon, December 1879): [On Christmas



Eve] carols were sung by the [Sunday] School and after a few appropriate remarks by the rector Rev. J. S. Colton a fine Christmas tree was unloaded to the delight of the children. These all received some gift and in addition fourteen scholars received Bibles from the rector for learning the catechism while three more received rewards for learning the ten commandments. A dozen or more had received the latter prize within a few weeks. The members of the choir were not forgotten and several of the teachers received gifts from their respective classes. In addition two other tokens of remembrance for the pastor and his family, a pocketbook containing \$28 was found on the tree addressed to Mr. and Mrs. Colton from the congregation. The usual church service was held on Christmas day. Mr. Colton officiated and the song of the angels, "Glory to God in the Highest" was the text of the sermon. The church was decorated in accordance with the old custom of the Episcopal Church and the music was appropriate and well rendered.
