A Look Back at St. John's History

95 years ago

Annual Parish Meeting Minutes, January 19, 1920: On account of a dinner served to the communicants and their families the attendance of men, women and children at this meeting totaled more than one hundred—or more than three times those usually present at an annual meeting. . . . [Among disbursements]: For the poor \$73.50; for the Society of the Friendless \$5.00; one plumber's plunger for unstopping drains \$.75.

75 years ago

Vestry Minutes, January 12, 1940: The Rector in his charge to the Vestry for the new year 1940, stressed three avenues for important vestry activities. He commended the People's Warden for his unfailing attendance upon the services of the Church each Sunday. He suggested that the scope of this vestry activity be widened to include this responsibility for each member of St. John's as well as their representatives upon the Vestry. This being "Church Press Week" as appointed by the Presiding Bishop, the Rector recommended (a) that an earnest effort be made by the members of the Vestry to see that the Parish Paper and at least one other official Church Publication be placed in every home in the parish and read by every member of the family (b) that the entire parish be divided into nine groups, each group to be headed by a vestryman, to encourage, by personal contact, the habitual attendance each Sunday of every member of the parish upon one or more of the services of that day; and predicted that when this was accomplished, the financial problems of the Vestry would be largely eliminated. (c) He referred to the article by Bishop Fenner in the last Kansas Churchman, commending St. John's people who had sponsored attendance upon the last Confirmation Instruction and recommended that this privilege of Sponsorship be extended until it should involve every communicant of the parish in at least a conscientious effort. . . . Certain work was done upon the organ in preparation for Christmas by Robert Flemming, and although no charge had been made, the vestry approved a gift of \$2.00 in appreciation of his services.

70 years ago

The Eagle of St. John's, January 27, 1945: In spite of the fact that almost 500 special offering envelopes were sent out last week for our offering for Theological Education Sunday, only \$31 was received by the parish treasurer for this purpose. Someone explains that it was a "bad" day. Whatever the cause, it was indeed a bad day for theological education in St. John's Parish. The offering will be held until more is received. All who care to contribute to this purpose and have not yet done so may find additional envelopes in the rear of the church building this Sunday. ~ Our offering should be at least \$100.

65 years ago

The Eagle of St. John's, January 21, 1950: Friday afternoon of this week at 1:30, there will be a Children's Workers Council meeting in the undercroft to which all workers with children in the community are urged to attend. The Superintendent of St. John's Sunday School, asks that the mothers of boys and girls of St. John's of Kindergarten and primary school ages, be present for this council meeting. The theme of the meeting is Children Around the World, and the women of St. John's will be hostesses at tea after the meeting.

60 years ago

Vestry Minutes, January 6, 1955: Mr. James Buck, Senior Warden, then reported that the marble for the altar had been received from Italy and that the church's architect from Kansas City would arrive in Wichita the next day to examine the altar, which is now stored with the Soderberg Construction Co. and make necessary arrangements to repair the damaged portions thereof and install the same in the church. It was found that the marble itself weighed 2100 lbs. and Mr. Buck stated that he had asked Mr. Soderberg to check the foundation and joists of the church where the altar was to be installed to see if they were sufficient to hold the weight thereof. ~ The Sunday School Planning Committee reported an attendance of 110 in Sunday School last Sunday and that the parish house was woefully inadequate to take care of that many people and that if we were to continue to grow he had to have additional space. . . the Vestry authorized the use of the old rectory for Sunday School purposes.



55 years ago

Parish Visitor, January 3, 1960: Though not members of St. John's Parish, the owners and operators of Steve's Candy Kitchen, 1411 E. Douglas, again donated the candy for the Christmas stockings which Santa Claus handed out to the children following the Christmas Pageant on the Sunday before Christmas. . . Thanks also to our young people for the nice job they did in decorating the tree which adorns the Undercroft, and to the Tally Wags for their time and effort in filling all the Christmas stockings. ~ January 10: S.O.S. These letters stand for a distress call on the sea. They also mean that you are to Save Old Stuff and bring it to the Undercroft for the Rummage Sale to be held on Friday, Jan. 22.

50 years ago

Vestry Minutes, January 14, 1965: Chairman of the Buildings and Grounds Committee reported that we had termites in the Temple and was receiving bids for extermination and repairs. He further reported that the Breese Hardware Co. would sell us an aluminum ladder, 12 feet long, for the sum of \$19.50, installation \$10, which would provide ample safety as a fire prevention
