**St. John's CROP Walkers Win  
Traveling Trophy Quilt for 2015**

On Sunday, November 8th, in the 10:30 a.m. service, St. John's will be presented with the CROP Walk Quilt for 2015, a traveling trophy awarded to the group that raises the most money for the fight against hunger in Wichita and around the world.

Twenty participants from St. John's raised \$3,237.38 on Sunday afternoon, October 4th, at Sedgwick County Park. Walkers signed on for either Team Earl or Team Ted, with a goal of raising \$1000 per team. With the help of generous donors, and led by their fearless team captains, they far surpassed their goals to win the prize for St. John's, but more importantly, to help end hunger "one step at a time." The quilt will be displayed at St. John's until next year's walk.

**ALTAR GUILD** will be oiling the woodwork in the church on Saturday, November 14th, at 9:00 a.m. All members of all ages are welcome to take part !

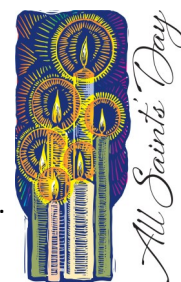

## St. John's History by Parish Historian, Katie Pott

105 years ago . .

### The Rev. Percy T. Fenn's 1910 Hand-Book of St. John's Parish: "PARISH BOUNDARIES, AND CLERICAL ETHICS"

The question has already been asked since the organization of St. Stephen's into a parish [1909], what are the boundaries of each of these two parishes? ~ Such a question as this is very difficult to answer. A fair eastern boundary of St. John's, and western boundary of St. Stephen's would be the Rock Island track, running north and south. ~ It is natural for us to assume, however, that those residing in the neighborhood of St. Stephen's will attend that church, and those residing near St. John's will attend St. John's. But there can be no compulsion—there is no law compelling such attendance. ~ As a matter of fact some who should be in St. Stephen's, attend St. John's and some who should be in St. John's, attend St. Stephen's. And, of course they will continue so to do. It must be to some extent, a matter of taste, and of individual preference. ~ If the members of either parish are

unhappy in their relationship, it is easy enough for them to make a change, by getting the proper letter of transfer. ~ But it must not be forgotten that the clergy are governed by a code of ethics which will be rigorously observed by your city clergy. ~ The Rector has no right to go into St. Stephen's parish for any ministerial act, whatever, except with the consent, and on the invitation of his reverend brother. And, to be very frank, he does not believe that he could do so even with such consent. For only once in his entire ministry, has he done such a thing, and then it was done for sentimental reasons which could not be ignored. ~ On the other hand, the Minister-in-charge of St. Stephen's will perform no function whatever, among the people of St. John's, unless requested so to do by its rector. ~ This is as it should be. The peace and happiness of both congregations, and the clergy who preside over them, will be enhanced by the recognition and observance of this code of ethics.

75 years ago . .

**Vestry minutes, November 8, 1940:** [A committee chairman reported] on the cost of plastering and redecorating the kitchen, robing room and toilet. It was the judgment of the committee that as far as possible bids should be submitted by members of the parish wherein such a course was possible. . . The report was received and placed on file. ~ The Rector spoke at length upon the Every Member Canvass the dates for which had not been set and it was decided to defer the matter until after the Thanksgiving Offering had been tabulated. The rector also advised that the Thanksgiving Offering be asked for the purpose of balancing the parish quota for the general Church Program amounting to \$204.00 and that the Rectors Pastoral set forth this purpose. ~ Quite a lengthy discussion was held following the reading of an article from the Witness on the fact that it was impossible to keep faith with pledged contributors who were promised in the Every Member Canvass that their pledge should be made for their full expectancies for the year, when they were constantly harassed for special gifts from societies and individuals for private enterprises. This was deplored and a resolution offered to the effect that no solicitation of funds within the parish should be made without the consent of the Vestry and then only from those who were not pledged contributors. The Rector was asked to so advise the parish through the columns of the parish paper as an aid to subscribing an adequate budget and this request was complied with in the issue of the parish paper of November 15th the Friday following the meeting of the Vestry.
