He Offered Us These Words

These last few weeks have proven to be unsettling for our St. John's family. It was difficult to say goodbye to Father Earl, a man everyone truly liked. It was difficult to begin building a rhythm for our worship, to begin establishing our new "normal." We needed comforting, we needed hope, we needed direction. Then in the midst of our first shaky steps came a Gospel reading with words meant for all of us.

They were the chosen ones; the ones closest to this man called Jesus. They had followed Him in glory into Jerusalem; they had basked in the joy of Palm Sunday. Then, though He had tried to tell his disciples, though he had tried to prepare them, He was gone. The unthinkable had forced them into hiding, fearful for their lives. He had not saved Himself! What were they to do? Where were they to go? While deep in their grief and confusion, word reached them that the stone had been rolled away, that His body was gone.

They didn't know then what we know now. It's doubtful they felt hope; He's gone and now someone has taken His body? It's doubtful that His Resurrection was even considered. Then a voice reached out to them; then a figure appeared. Jesus had come back! Jesus was there among them. He lives!

They had been beside him for so long, yet they had not fully heard. They had walked with Him, yet they had not fully understood. Jesus now set about preparing these men to continue His work. In earnest, Jesus repeated His lessons. Encouraging. Reassuring. Building confidence. These men had to understand if they were to go out into the world to spread The News.

Following a meal one evening Jesus drew them in and asked Simon Peter "Do you love me more than these?" Peter assured Him he did and Jesus told him, "Feed my lambs." A second time Jesus asked Peter, "Do you love me?" and Peter again assured Him that he did. "Tend my sheep." Yet a third time Jesus asked, "Do you love me?" And again Peter told Him he did. Jesus responded, "Feed my sheep."

Every week in our bulletin we see the names of members of our St. John's family who need us. Every week in our Prayers of the People we *hear* the names of those who need us. Every week at our back door we *respond* to those who need us. St. John's is in the midst of change but these words, His words, can serve to guide us. In our own discomfort may we reach out to those around us, to His sheep.

Gracious Father, make us ever mindful of Your presence among us. Help us remember that YOU are the reason we are here; YOU are the reason St. John's exists. May our thoughts and actions be reflective of the work you would have us to do. Amen.

To Our Parish Family,

This is a letter that I hoped to not have to write, but as we near the end of the choir season in May we have a situation that must be met head-on. Because of budget cuts the choir will be out of money by June. We may have a few hundred dollars left in our account but not nearly enough to get us through the remainder of the year. Most of this money is spent on our paid singers. We pay four people - a soprano, alto, tenor and bass - to supplement our choir during the year. These people not only



help our choir sound better, they add numbers to sections that are small and might barely be heard without them. All of them are good musicians and we depend on them to enhance our overall balance and blend.

At our annual meeting I introduced an "adopt-a-singer" program to help offset the shortage of funds. Anyone could make a donation. The suggested amount was \$50 for one week, \$100 for two weeks, etc. Tammy and I said that we would get the ball rolling by adopting a singer for the entire fall semester which would be \$800. This would leave us \$2200 to raise out of the original \$3000 needed. So far, there have been no additional contributions. If we wish to keep our paid singers we need to know by the end of May whether we will have the additional monies needed to keep the choir going this fall. If we fall short, not only will we lose our paid singers but the choir most likely will not be able to continue. Five or six people simply cannot function as a choir, especially if parts are missing or if someone is absent some Sunday who may be the only alto or bass.

I certainly do not want to see us lose our choir. It has been a vital part of St. John's for almost 145 years, but we definitely need your help and support if we are to continue this ministry. Please carefully consider making a contribution to the choir fund. No amount is too small (or too large!) as we try to reach our goal of \$2200.

St. John's History

120 years ago...

Easter Souvenir Mirror, 1896: H. A. Bliss. Organist of St. John's Church.

H.A. Bliss has been the organist for St. John's church for the last eighteen years, with the exception of about two years, that he was not living in Wichita. He has been constant and devoted in his duties, never missing service when it could be avoided. He has given his aid in the musical part of the service of the church without stopping to take into consideration the question of compensation. When the parish was able he has been paid a small salary, but when it was not in a condition to pay he asked none; and often when by agreement he was to be paid, he waived it until other obligations of the church were first satisfied. Mr. Bliss is an accomplished organist, and his services at the organ has aided much in making the service pleasing and impressive. Not a few have been drawn to the church because of his presiding at the organ. ~ During the ministry of Mr. Rhames he suggested and assisted in the organization of an Antiphonal Choir, but it did not prove to be as successful as desired, and after Mr. von Herrlich became rector the matter was again taken up and under the directorship of Mrs. J. C.



Leathe the present Vested Choir was organized. Mrs. Leathe devoted much of her time to the work, without compensation, and was ably assisted by Mrs. Dr. Day. The choir is under the able directorship of Miss Grace Hatton, and has been brought to a high standard of perfection. ~ Mr. Bliss was always ably assisted by Mr. Ed. McGill, who has always been an indefatigable worker in the church. ~ Mr. Bliss, by his disinterested and long continued aid to the church has endeared himself to all its members, and won the commendation of the people of Wichita, generally.

9 years ago...

"They are a real church..."

I came to Wichita to join the music faculty at WSU in 1965. I had expanded a graduate religion minor into a divinity degree and spent the weekends of my first two years in Presbyterian pulpits. I began to yearn for musical activity on weekends – especially something that involved both choir and organ (a rare situation in Wichita). In the fall of 1967, I was having coffee with Bob Edwards, organist-choirmaster at St. John's. He was planning to leave and I wanted to learn whether I might be interested in applying for the job. His descriptions included the sometimes difficult, aging rector, the choir, the organ, etc. What most impressed me was his description of the people: "they come from both sides of the tracks, some whose history with the church is generations long and some newer members, several influential lawyers and several laboring people... they know why they come and who they are as they come to the altar... rectors will come and they will go, but the core of the congregation seems to be very stable... they are a real church...they care about each other and about those who may join." I could tell he loved the place. I applied. After 40+ years of my own observation up close and at a distance I believe he spoke the truth. — David Childs, Fall 2007


