## Curate's Report

### We Only Get Better Together

When Benjamin was first born, I remember carrying him around the living room cradled in my arms. I would sing to him or gently rock him, all in an effort to sooth him, entertain him, or coax him off to sleep. We often listened to music, especially *Fields of Gold*, a collection of hits by the singer-songwriter Sting. One my favorites was, "All This Time," which he wrote following the death of his father. The central image is a river, which symbolizes perpetuity and continuity. Civilizations rise and fall; institutions come and go; people live and die. And yet through it all, the river continues to flow. "All this time, the river flowed endlessly to the sea." Though I like the song a great deal, there is one bit that I always question. In the concluding lyric, Sting sings, "*Men go crazy in congregations, but they only get better one by one, ... one by one... one by one....*"

I don't believe that. Not really. Not after all is said and done. Oh, there is plenty of evidence to demonstrate that it is difficult, and sometimes very painful, to participate in the life of a congregation. But the church does not have a monopoly on dysfunction. Dysfunction and brokenness features in all human organizations and communities—be they faith-based, familial, civic, or secular. Nevertheless, the fact remains that we don't get better one by one; we only get better in congregations. It is only as we worship and work together, as we pray, study, and celebrate together that we get better, that we become transformed human beings, persons of faith, people of love, mercy, and compassion. *We only get better together.* If it were otherwise, I would not be a Christian. There would be no point.

### Christian Formation and Discipleship

As a Curate, one area I have concentrated has been the area of Christian formation and discipleship. Christian formation is what we do to participate with the Holy Spirit in our ongoing growth and transformation. Christian discipleship is about apprenticing ourselves to Jesus; it is about learning to walk the way of Jesus in our daily lives. Said another way, Christian formation and discipleship is about living into our baptism. Of course, none of this is possible on our own. We need God; we need each other. So our programs of Christian Formation and Discipleship here at St. John's are designed to connect us with God and with one another. In support of these values, last winter, we opened, "The Lenten Café: A Diet of Spiritual Formation for a Holy Lent." The Lenten Café featured our traditional Lent and Holy Week worship and our annual Lenten Luncheon Series. But it also introduced new items to the menu, "Getting Away with Jesus" (Saturday Quiet Days) and "Sitting with Jesus" (Contemplative Prayer & Bible Study on Wednesday evenings). These two new programs were brought back in the Fall, and they have become a regular part of what we do here at St. John's, all in our effort to get better together.

### Get Involved and Get Others Involved

So as we go forward into our 146th year, let us be ever mindful of how much we need each other and of how much we need to be there *for* each other. And not just in times of crisis. We need to be there for one another as we engage in the regular habits and practices of Christian formation and discipleship. For example, when we miss Sunday morning worship (and there are occasions when this is unavoidable), it is not just we who have missed church, but church has missed us. That is because we are part of a body, the living, growing Body of Christ. Our absence affects the health of the whole Body, just as our presence, participation, and engagement contributes to the health of the whole Body.

So get involved, and get others involved. Attend church regularly, and invite somebody else to church. Start participating in an adult forum, a bible study, or a prayer group; and get somebody else to come along with you. Only then can we become the persons and the people that God has called us to be, for we all go crazy when we are on our own; *we only get better when we are together.*

## A Look Back at St. John's History

### 115 years ago

Vestry minutes, February 18, 1900: Moved to present a petition to the people an appeal to remove the floating debt of approximately \$400. This effort to have a reference to Lenten self-denial and Easter offering. Mr. Vail to make such an appeal to the people after service next Sunday as would properly introduce the matter, giving figures where necessary. ~ The name of Rev. Mr. Ritchie of Webster Grove near St. Louis was enrolled as a desirable candidate for rector. ~ Treasurer reports that both the Young Peoples Chapter and the Parish Aid Chapter pledge a monthly amount of \$25 for the general support of the church.

Wichita Beacon, February 17 and 19: On next Monday night the Young Peoples' Chapter at St. John's church will give its sixth annual birthday party at Sedgwick Music hall. A musical program will be rendered and the farce "Wanted — A Deaf Man," will be given. ~ The Sunday school of St. John's church gave a pancake social in Guild hall yesterday evening.

### 110 years ago

Vestry minutes, February 12, 1905: Called meeting at Mr. Comley's. Dr. Fenn present and gave us a very pleasant talk. Moved to call Dr. Fenn at \$2000 a year, together with telephone, rent and use of the rectory, also we to pay expenses of moving from Texarkana here. Dr. Fenn thanked the vestry and promised to let them know in ten days.

### 70 years ago

Vestry minutes, February 7, 1945: An offer of \$15 for the bath tub upstairs in the parish house, was presented to the vestry by the Rector. Motion to sell the tub and place the funds in the Theological Education fund carried. ~ The matter of memorial tablets being placed in the church as a policy of the church was presented for discussion. The memorial tablet for Dr. Fenn was especially discussed. In order to place the matter before the vestry for discussion it was moved, seconded, that no memorial tablets, per se, be placed in St. John's Church; then after considerable discussion of the matter the vote was called and motion carried. ~ The Rector then presented the matter of the parish's having a need for an architect skilled in building churches and suggested the name of Mr. W.D. Wight of Kansas City, Mo. Moved that Mr. Wight be appointed and that he have charge of any building program or remodeling to be undertaken by the parish. February 9: The Rector outlined a plan for parish development: 1. 1945—Purchase and pay for Rectory and Parish House building site. 2. 1945-46-47—Repair, enlarge and modernize church building. 3. 1947-48—Erect parish house. 4. 1949-50—Rebuild front of church. Approved that the 1945 project be carried out this year. . Means of getting the necessary funds for these two projects were then discussed, and it was found that approximately \$20,000 would be required. It was unanimously decided to enter immediately upon a campaign to raise this amount. Towards it, those present pledged a total of \$4,500. Marked enthusiasm was shown by all present. ~ A suitable site for a parish house was then discussed. Moved that the two lots lying adjacent to St. John's Church building on the north be purchased; . . .and that \$1000 be paid with the contract to purchase, leaving the balance to be paid within 60 days. All present voted in the affirmative.

### 65 years ago

Vestry minutes, February 12, 1950: The Building Committee recommended that the house at 416 N. Topeka be removed as soon as possible, in order to include that ground for parking lot. Motion tabled.

### 50 years ago

***Vestry minutes, February 25, 1965: The Rector then reported that for the coming Lenten season, all Episcopal Parishes and Missions in the City of Wichita will have a regular weekly Lenten luncheon at the Allis Hotel, Tuesday of each week beginning March 9, and that all Episcopal Churches and Missions in Wichita would join in communion services every Wednesday at 12:00 o'clock noon, at St. John's during the Lenten season.***

### 45 years ago

Vestry minutes, February 12, 1970: The advisability and economic feasibility of placing protective covering upon the various windows of the Church building was then fully discussed. Also requested that the Buildings and Grounds committee continue efforts to solve the problems regarding the proposed installation of an elevator.

## New Dillons Community Rewards Program Begins in February

### A customer must have 3 things to register and begin supporting St. John's Episcopal Church:

1. A Plus card, which is available at any store by asking an associate
2. A valid email address, which can be obtained from any free online service and can be anonymous (if you don't use email, contact the parish office at 262-0897 and we can set your Plus Card up for you.)
3. A personalized account at Dillons website, which again can be anonymous.
