## Rector's Journal: Spirit Turned Loose

***"The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit."*** John 3:8

As I begin my fifth year of living with you here on the Kansas prairie, I think I've gotten used to the powerful effects of the wind here in the middle of the United States, "fly over country," as it is sometimes referred to those traveling above from coast to coast. Yet, just as soon as I think I've become acclimated to it, another spring storm will blow through the Midwest and I'll be amazed again to see the impact the wind has had on the world around us. Often the effects of the wind are disastrous and catastrophic, but at other times the wind can be a great source of beauty and comfort, bringing relief from the heat in the form of a cool breeze or delivering a gentle sprinkling shower to nourish the land, rivers, lakes, and streams, and the various forms of life that depend on them, us included.



Perhaps all of this, and more, are what make the wind such an apt metaphor for the Spirit of God. The passage above from the third chapter of the Gospel of John, read recently on The Feast of the Holy Trinity, reminds us that the Spirit's effects are all around us and we humans, as clever as we may like to think of ourselves, are really clueless when it comes to knowing and understanding the works of the Holy Spirit, much less being able to predict them. The best we can hope for, Jesus suggests, is that, like the wind, we would recognize in our own lives and in the lives of other people, the signs and evidence of the Spirit's blowing activity.

Being born of the Spirit means recognizing that we are to the Holy Spirit what the atmosphere is to the wind. We are to the Spirit what the ocean is to a wave. In other words, we are the abode of the Spirit, we who are born of the Spirit. The Spirit chooses you and me, the Body of Christ, the Church as its dwelling place. A comforting prospect, if not a little frightening as well, none the less, a prospect that gives each of us the opportunity to choose how we will display the wind of the Spirit blowing in our lives.

I would invite you to let St. John's Church be a primary avenue for each of us to live as God's born anew people. The mission and ministries of this parish provide each of us with the means to the end that all God's people are called to seek, loving God and loving our neighbors as ourselves, giving of our time, talents, and treasures for the church to carry out its mission, and, as the Collect for Pentecost reminds us, "**...preaching [of] the Gospel, that it may reach to the ends of the earth.**" (BCP p.227)


#### **"The Process of Forgiveness"**

## Proper Worship Etiquette (or how to behave in church!)

### 1907 The Rev. Dr. Percy T. Fenn's *St. John's Parish Hand-Book*

We still note more late-comers at our services. When will our people learn to honor God, and to respect the feelings of their fellow worshippers by coming early? Don't forget that the confession of your sins and God's comforting absolution are far more valuable to you than the petty sermon, and do try to come early? . . . And what about reverence? We notice that some of our young people seem more full of giggles than of reverence. But do hold these in check until you get outside the House of God.

### 1908 The Rev. Dr. Percy T. Fenn's *St. John's Parish Hand-Book*



May we remind you of the necessity of coming to Holy Communion in time for the Confession and Absolution. We have a few who come in occasionally just before the distribution of the Elements, and who come to the Altar in that unprepared condition. This is decidedly improper. Nobody should come to the Holy Eucharist who has not made his public confession. ~ And we notice an unseemly desire to rush out of the Church right after receiving, and before the Post Communion service. This also is improper. If you have not sufficient time to stay through the late Celebrations, why not get up and come to the early service on Sundays? This is Primitive and Apostolic; the other is Modern and Protestant! ~ We notice that some of the oldest members of the congregation, who come late repeatedly, still walk into the Church during Confession and Absolution. We referred to the impropriety of this in our last Hand-book, and are sorry to have to do so this year. It is very disturbing to the entire congregation to have late comers enter and walk up the aisles whilst we are upon our knees. And it is never done in well-informed parishes!

### 1942 *Holy Communion: What It Means And How To Prepare For It*, by Bishop Charles Lewis Slattery



On entering the Church, say these two prayers, kneeling: . . . If some time remain before the beginning of the Service, rise from your knees and sit quietly reading one or more of these Psalms or Hymns: . . . the offering at the Holy Communion is always, directly or indirectly, for the poor. In putting your gifts in the plate, ask God's blessing on the cause for which they are given. Remember that the Bread and Wine, which are now placed upon the Holy Table, are part of your offering; therefore stand in token of your share in giving them, and remain standing till the Priest saith, Let us pray . . . during the time which passeth before going forward to receive the Holy Communion, remain kneeling, praying earnestly in your own words . . . On going forward to receive the Holy Communion, say this prayer, having learned it previously: ~ Kneeling at the Communion Rail, with ungloved hands, place one hand upon the other, awaiting the administration of the Bread, when a broken fragment of it will be placed in the palm of the hand. Think of the Savior in the upper room the night before he was crucified. Imagine yourselves of the blessed company. Think of him as coming to you now, to give you his very life, while the words are said: ~ Reverently raise both your hands to your lips and eat the bread, giving thanks in your own words. When the cup is given to you, receive it firmly in both hands, and raise or guide it to your lips, while these words are said: ~ While kneeling at the Communion Rail, say these words, having previously learned them: ~ Return quietly to your seats, and kneel both to pray and to listen to the Divine Voice within your hearts. Be careful to keep your eyes either closed or fixed upon your books. [To look about, when on your knees, is irreverent.] ~ If there be many to receive the Sacrament, and the time be longer than can devoutly be occupied upon your knees, sit during the time which remaineth after having finished your prayers; and, being careful not to look about, read, out of the Prayer Book or the Hymnal, the following: ~ Go from the Church, if it be possible, without speaking to any one, and try to be quiet on the way to your home. But be ready to do a deed of kindness and help instantly, if the opportunity comes, remembering that our Savior went down from the Mountain of Transfiguration to heal a poor sick boy. Fix in your minds the fact that Christ lives in you afresh by your faith. Therefore pray that he will express himself through you, to bring gladness and righteousness into the world.

### 1950 The Rev. James C. Hoffman's *Eagle of St. John's Church, April 8, 1950*

Those desiring to receive the Holy Communion by intinction are requested to come to the communion rail first. All who wish to receive the Cup are asked to come last, leaving a pause between the two types of administration.

### 1955 The Rev. F. J. Raasch's *The Parish Visitor, March 20, 1955*

We had our two services of Holy Communion in the Undercroft last Wednesday morning and it seemed to discommode no one at all. If you find it too difficult to kneel, then don't kneel. Just lean forward and use the "holy squat" which many people use anyways even in the church proper.
