Expanding our Worship Language

In 1789, the newly formed Episcopal Church in the United States, freshly separated from the mother Church of England, adopted this preface to our new Book of Common Prayer:

It is a most invaluable part of that blessed "liberty wherewith Christ hath made us free," that in his worship different forms and usages may without offense be allowed, provided the substance of the Faith be kept entire . . . Therefore by common consent and authority, may be altered, abridged, enlarged, amended, or otherwise disposed of as may seem most convenient for the edification of the people, "according to the various exigencies of times and occasions."

Our Prayer Book language used to describe God is based on the ancient practice of patriarchy as the foundation of an ordered society, and of the man as the normative representative human being. In the years since our last Prayer Book revision in 1979 American society has seen rapid change in our understanding of women's roles in our society.

Since 1979 the Episcopal Church has authorized "expanded language" daily office and Eucharistic prayers for use the Church. These rites lift up scriptural female images used to express the reality of God in our midst. Writings from early church theologians, and the medieval mystics, have been also added.

St. John's has worshipped with some of these rites over ten years ago. I'm bringing them back for our Sunday worship in Advent, Christmas and Epiphany seasons for the 10:30 AM congregation, and only the Sundays in Advent for the 8 AM congregation.

Enjoy these fresh language and images which bespeak the divine reality among us. Swim in them. Savor them. Thank God for full appreciation of both genders in our halting and limited vocabulary to speak of the Unspeakable.

Music for an Interim Time

One of the opportunities of the interim time between clergy leadership is to allow the congregation to dream dreams and behold new visions. To midwife these possibilities for our music ministry I have decided, in full consultation with our choir director Ken Breeden and the Vestry, to set a new musical course over the coming months:

Our dedicated and faithful choir will take a sabbatical leave for at least a year starting December 31, 2016. Ken and organist Joel Brejda's contracts with the parish, which end on December 31 this year, will be combined together to create an Interim Parish Musician position to run from January 15, 2107 until Easter Sunday 2018. The Musician will play piano or organ on Sundays and Feast Days, procure and conduct guest musicians twice a month and on Feast Days, and generally share her or his gifts and talents broadly for the worship of God in our midst. 

100 years ago . .

The Rev. Percy T. Fenn's 1916 Official Hand-Book of St. John's Parish:

THE EVERY MEMBER CANVASS

We are under many obligations to the Rev. Edward Henry Eckel for suggesting, directing and animating the every member canvass which was made in our parish last October. But if it had not been for the splendid response on the part of our men it could not have been carried through successfully. Those who took part in it were dominated by a purpose, and they went to work with enthusiasm. The majority of our people were reached, and nearly all who were seen became contributors. We were proud of our men when we heard of the result of their work. And we are most grateful to those of our women who served both lunch and supper to the workers on that day. They did it without a murmur of dissent. But this is the way our women always work. God bless them.

Our financial condition has much improved, but we need an extra \$50 a month to bring our receipts up to our expenditures. There are many in the parish who as yet contribute nothing regularly, and we appeal to them to do their duty.

A TRIPLE ANNIVERSARY

On the first of May your rector began his twelfth year here, on the 10th he celebrated the twenty-fifth anniversary of his ordination to the Priesthood, and on the 12th, the twenty-fifth anniversary of his wedding. He expected to celebrate these days quietly, but you would not let him. The reception you prepared for, and gave to him and his family, on the night of the tenth—at the home of Mr. and Mrs. C. A. Magill—was one of the pleasantest surprises of his life.

For your thoughtfulness, for your expressions of real affection, for the substantial gifts of silver, we thank you most heartily.

The reception was a big affair, was planned and executed most successfully, and there was such a tone of good feeling as we have seldom seen anywhere. We felt that those who came were all our friends—and what a crowd it was—and we came home feeling more in love with Wichita than ever, and convinced that we have the dearest people on earth to live with. God bless you all for remembering us at such a time. We shall never forget it.

OUR USHERS

Our two Wardens are our ushers at the morning service, and they do their work well. But at the night service the people have to get along as best they can, for we never have any ushers. It is not an absolute necessity, for there are always plenty of vacant seats in the church; but it is a proper thing to have two ushers at every service, and we hope this may be arranged for. And may we suggest two things: First, that they seat the people as far forward as possible, and, secondly, that they hold the people at the doors—if they come in late—until the congregation has risen from its knees. Nobody should be seated during the Confession and Absolution.
