# Having a "Fierce" New Year

I want to share with the wider congregation some concepts of "Fierce Conversations" which I presented at formation hour on Sunday morning months ago. Some of your may have heard references to it, and may like to know more about it.

Susan Scott wrote "Fierce Conversation: Achieving Success at Work and in Life, One Conversation at a Time". "Fierce" in this context means robust, strong, powerful, passionate, eager. She maintains that each and every conversation between people IS their relationship. She writes that when necessary we can confront one another in our conversations with courage, compassion and skill.

Church folks are often reticent to be direct with one another, believing that the Gospel asks us to "be nice" rather than clear. Need to have a difficult conversation with another person at St. John's or elsewhere in your life? Here's a way into it:

**Opening Statement**: Write your opening statement and practice saying it out loud, in sixty seconds or less. Your opening statement should:

- I. Name the issue.
- 2. Select a specific example that illustrates the behavior or situation that concerns you and you want to change.
- 3. Describe your emotions about this issue.
- 4. Clarify what is at stake.
- 5. Identify your contribution to this problem.
- 6. Indicate your wish to resolve the issue.
- 7. Invite your partner to respond.

#### Interaction:

8. Inquire into your partner's views. Use paraphrasing and a perception check. Dig for full understanding; don't be satisfied with the surface. Make sure your partner knows that you fully understand and acknowledge his or her position and interests.

#### **Resolution**:

- 9. What have we learned? Where are we now? Has anything been left unsaid that needs saying? What is needed for resolution? How can we move forward from here, given our new understanding?
- 10. Make a new agreement and determine how you will hold each other responsible for keeping it.

This model for having difficult conversations with one another takes a lot of preparation and commitment, requires humility and compassion, and asks us to take responsibility for the emotions which our words may evoke in another. Perhaps this is what is meant by Jesus, "Love one another as I have loved you."

# Parish History — Katie Pott, Parish Historian

From the Rev. Percy T. Fenn's 1907 Handbook of St. John's Parish:

**OUR ANNUAL PARISH MEETING** The meeting last Advent was marked by the utmost unanimity and good feeling. It was not largely attended--we think there were forty or more persons present--but that was an encouraging sign.

Parish meetings are never largely attended unless there are dissensions and rival tickets in the field. We know of one large and wealthy Parish, not far from New York City, where the Rector and his Sexton used to elect the entire Vestry. And that Parish was always prosperous. Still it is well for our parishioners to come and listen to reports, and acquaint themselves with the work that is being done amongst them. And it is well for them to do their part to elect good men on the Vestry.

This is precisely what was done at our last meeting. Reports were read, showing the very healthy condition of the Parish and its finances, and then the men . . were elected Wardens and Vestrymen. These men have worked well in the past, they are always unfalteringly loyal to their Rector, and we feel sure that the Parish will always bear them in mind hereafter.

# The Rev. Percy T.Fenn's 1912 Hand-Book of St. John's Parish:

MARRIAGE OF DIVORCED PERSONS Your rector is asked unceasingly to marry divorced people. He turns away more couples than you can imagine. But, unfortunately, there are many Sectarian ministers who will marry anybody for the sake of the petty fee! Their guilt seems to us to be not altogether unlike that of Judas Iscariot! ~ There is one set in the city whose minister is always renowned for this. A few days ago he married a couple whom your rector had declined to marry. And the sect this man represents professes to be very scriptural! There are some men who will sell their souls for gold; but we hate to see men who profess to be preachers do such a thing! ~ Dean Sumner—the Dean of our Cathedral at Chicago—will not only not marry any couple—high or low—unless they have a physician's certificate. ~ And yet there are men in this city, calling themselves Christians, who will marry any moral degenerates who may come to them, even if they have been married a dozen times before!!!
