A Holy Lent is Right Before You

There are many, many resources available to you as you consider how you will spiritually stretch yourself in the Lenten season of preparation for the new birth of Easter. I've several links below for your consideration.

My primary recommendation to you is your own St. John's Parish Library. Mike Morrow has lovingly tended, and stocked, these shelves to the glory of God and in loving memory of Mildred and Miriam Morrow, his mother and aunt. St. John's is the best parish scripture resource library I have every known.

Will you commit to reading a book of the Bible during Lent? On the north wall opposite the doors . . .

Use the classic and highly accessible commentaries of William Barclay (1907-1978) the Scottish author, radio and TV personality, Church of Scotland minister and university professor.

Or, use the "For Everyone" commentaries on the books of the New Testament by respected scholar and Anglican bishop Tom Wright.

Or, use the "Conversations with Scripture" series from the Anglican Association of Biblical Scholars. These are fresh, non-technical, and engaging.

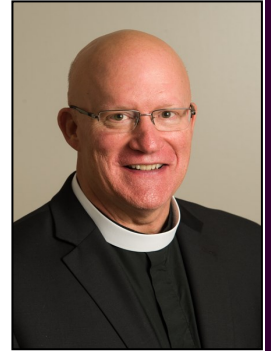
Or, read what past Christians have had to say on a passage in the Inter-varsity Press' "Ancient Christian Commentary on Scripture" series.

Or, bask in the meditations of the "Devotional Commentary Series" on the New Testament by Paulist Press

The shelves also hold numerous one-volume Bible commentaries across the theological spectrum, as well as foundational books on church history, Episcopal Church history, prayer and spirituality. Come and browse!

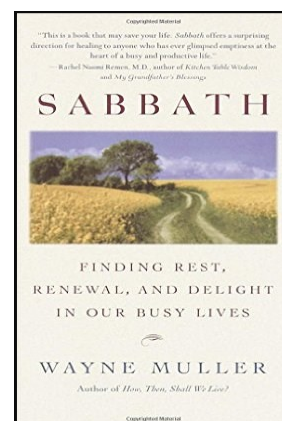

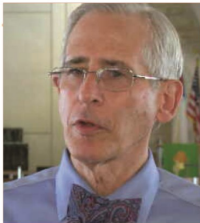

St. John's 2020: A Clear Vision for our Future Search Process Update

You may remember hearing the phrase, "St. John's 2020: A Clear Vision for our Future" during the kick-off of our rector search process. It's more than a phrase associated with our search process; it's the overarching framework for our work as a community of faith as we move forward with transforming and revitalizing St. John's.

Several key events are planned for the coming months to advance the St. John's 2020 process. The first of these requires active engagement by all members of the parish. During the month of March, a series of listening sessions will be held to provide members of St. John's an opportunity to share their input for the future of St. John's. This is a chance for members to provide additional feedback that will build on what was learned through the CAT (Congregational Assessment Tool) which was completed by St. John's members in December and January.

You may receive a phone call from a search team member during the final week of February inviting you to a specific focus group based on your role or background at St. John's. **If you do not participate in a specific focus group, please sign up to attend one of the open listening sessions, which will be held between and following services on March 5 and 12 in the library and undercroft.** Sign-up sheets will be located on the bulletin board outside the Library.

Parish History — *Katie Pott, Parish Historian*

A Few More Facts on a Few of Fenn's Flock

Faces Found on the History bulletin board across from the parlor.

Mrs. Walter B. Buck (Josephine Wallace Buck)

The Rev. Percy T. Fenn's 1907 Handbook: Sunday School teacher;

1908: S.S. teacher, president of The Woman's Auxiliary; 1910: S.S. teacher, president Woman's Auxiliary Board of Missions, secretary-treasurer of Daughters of the King;

1912: "We congratulate Mrs. W. B. Buck, our devoted President (W. A), upon what has been, and is still being accomplished under her intelligent and consecrated leadership."

1913: S.S. teacher, "volunteer" choir member [occasions when the men and boys are not available], "Mrs. Buck is still at the helm of the Auxiliary, and we dare not try to imagine what it would be without her. She is not only devout and conscientious, but she sticks."

1914: "Mrs. Buck kindly loaned her cook for the occasion, and he arranged 'real meals' for the boys." [Camp Bide-a-Wee for the choir boys for two weeks.] "Under its [W.A.] devoted and beloved President, Mrs. W. B. Buck, it has accomplished a splendid year's work. . . . Our thanks are due to Mrs. Buck, who has had a heavy load to carry for many months, for her untiring fidelity to duty. And we wish her such success as her devotion merits."

1916: S.S. teacher, W.A. President, "delegate to the Provincial Synod which met in Kansas City last January. She has returned home with stimulated interest for Missions." "The donor of a gold medal for her S.S. class next Easter is Mrs. W. B. Buck. In the name of the Parish we thank her."

1919: substitute S.S. teacher, W.A. President; "At the last Convention of the Diocese Mrs. W. B. Buck was elected Diocesan President of the Woman's Auxiliary. She deserved the honor, and we congratulate her. It means a good deal of the hardest kind of work, but she is capable as well as efficient. May she retain the office for many years!"

Wichita This Week, December 22, 1960: In Silent Tribute ~ The sunlight is streaming through three stained glass windows. ~ The time is the Sunday before Christmas, the place St. John's Episcopal Church, and the windows bright with yellow, green, and blue — and representing the Birth, Death, and Resurrection of Christ. They stand in silent tribute to Josephine Wallace Buck. ~ Underneath these three east windows is a beautiful altar of oak with reredos of white marble . . . The handsome installation of 1955 also includes a communion rail, flower niches on either side of the altar, sedilia, and bishop's chair. Gifts in silent tribute to Mrs. Buck by her sons, James Wallace Buck, and Walter Philip Buck. ~ Also in her memory was the Josephine Buck Guild at St. John's. ~ She was Regent of the Eunice Sterling Chapter of the Daughters of American Revolution. A member of the Wichita Country Club, the Thursday Afternoon Cooking Club, Hypatia loved Mrs. Buck. ~ This lovely little lady was a favorite at the store, too. Once, at a store party, in her sweet, motherly way, she related her trip abroad, to the delight of all. ~ And especially now at Christmas time, in church and in the family firm of Buck's, Inc., her sons—James and Phil—and their sons James Jr., John, Phil Jr., Tom and Bob follow her when they heed the words of Paul in II Timothy 2:15: "Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth."

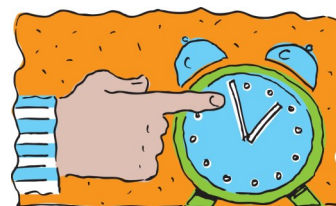
